We were living in Rome at the time, and brought our iMac with us -- it worked
fine with the foreign electricity. We rented movies to watch on our iMac and
had brought movies from the US as well. Each time a disc was inserted that had
a different region than the previous disc, the player would ask if we wanted
to switch region and warned that we only had a limited number of times before
the switch became permanent. (I think it was 3 switches total) We had to
either stop renting or stop watching our own movies until we came back to the
states and could feed it a steady diet of NA region discs.
