
Dear Witnesses:

Thank you for your participation in the recent hearing related to Proposed Class 19: Jailbreaking–video game consoles as part of the Copyright Office’s Section 1201 rulemaking proceeding. As a follow-up to certain matters discussed at the hearing, we would like to provide you with an opportunity to provide written responses to the following questions:

1. Please address whether it is necessary to circumvent one or more technological protection measures in order to replace or “reflash” an optical drive for a Sony Playstation 3 or Microsoft Xbox 360 video game console and, if so, provide a description of that process.
2. Please state for the record whether, and under what circumstances, Sony and Microsoft offer repair services, respectively, for the Playstation 3 or Xbox 360 video game consoles. Please note whether console repair services are available for consoles that are under warranty, out of warranty, or both.

Please provide your responses **no later than the close of business Monday, June 22, 2015**. Such responses should identify the responding party and the proposed class at issue, and should be no more than five pages in length. Please note that no further exhibits will be accepted.
