

**ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO ACCEPT AND REFER
GEO'S LATE-FILED BRIEF**

On October 21, 2015, George Johnson filed with the Copyright Royalty Judges (Judges) a Motion to Accept and Refer to the Register Geo's Response Brief to the Novel Material Question of Substantive Law. The subject response brief was due on October 9 and filed on October 16. Mr. Johnson is pro se, not an attorney, and was without staff to assist in the preparation of his brief. In his motion, he represented that the Register is willing to accept the late brief if the Judges are. Accompanying the motion was a corrected version of the brief. The Judges received no opposition to the motion.

The Judges find the explanation for the delay reasonable and hereby accept for filing the corrected version of GEO's Response Brief to the Novel Material Question of Substantive Law and refer the same to the Register of Copyrights.
